Humanities elective: course should provide students with knowledge of the history and creation of music and art, or knowledge of literary, philosophical, or religious efforts to interpret and illuminate human existence. Honors sections accepted.

Culture, Race, Ethnicity and Gender elective: course should provide students with knowledge and analysis of theoretical concerns, social experiences, or creative works arising from human diversity in the United States and the world community to which it belongs. Honors sections accepted.

Family and Human Behavior elective: course should provide students with knowledge of individual, family, and group behavior. Honors sections accepted.

Political Science and Social Organizations elective: course should provide students with knowledge of the structure and governance of societies, including policies, institutions and processes; the characteristics of economic practices and systems; or the interplay of human activity and the natural environment. Honors sections accepted.

- Pre-requisite courses marked with an asterisk* must be taken within 7 years prior to the program start date.
- Courses that must have a grade include Anatomy, Physiology, Chemistry, Statistics, College Algebra, Nutrition, and Microbiology.
- A maximum of 12 credit hours of pre-requisite coursework can be non-graded (P/NP, CLEP, AP, DANTES, etc.)
- Applicants must have a current CNA Certification when they apply to the program.
