## **POSITION SUMMARY:**

Instructor's primary focus is teaching students how to speak and understand the Umonhon language. The additional responsibilities include supporting the promotion of the Umonhon language, culture, and the community. The responsibility extends to teaching up to (4) classes of Umonhon Language/Culture courses per semester from Macy Campus, with the possibility of teaching audiences on other campus locations with technology support. Teaching schedule may include assignments on other campuses, day and evening classes and coordinating or teaching immersion courses and programs. Candidate will also serve on and attend college committees as assigned.

# **MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS (REQUIRED):**

Must hold certificate based on Omaha Tribe of Nebraska's Resolution 01-115

High School Diploma or equivalency (GED) required

Able to understand spoken Umonhon

Able to speak Umonhon with good expression and pronunciation

Work with curriculum specialist and community members to help develop strong curriculum

Work within Native American Studies Division's goals and structure, and include Elders, Clans and Community in programming and goals

### PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS (NOT REQUIRED):

Able to consult either written documentation or recordings and help students find words they want to learn Able to use teaching materials, activities, and lesson plans that have been developed by or shared with NICC Involve students with language-related volunteer opportunities

Advocate for language in the community

Adult teaching experience is preferred
