HIGH SCHOOL EARLY COLLEGE ENROLLMENT FORM

The Early College program provides the opportunity for students currently enrolled in high school to enroll in dual-credit (i.e., students can earn college credit AND meet high school graduation requirements) or college credit courses. Students need to provide the following documentation:

- A complete NICC admission package: Online admission application and copy of Tribal enrollment if applicable.
- An Early College form with required signatures filed with the Registrar's Office.

High school students are not eligible for Federal financial aid. Since all NICC sponsored dual credit systems are housed in high schools that do not have BIE funding, NICC will count dually enrolled high school students in our Form 22 for the ISC Report annually. NICC encourages all Nebraska high school students to complete the ACE Scholarship application.
